

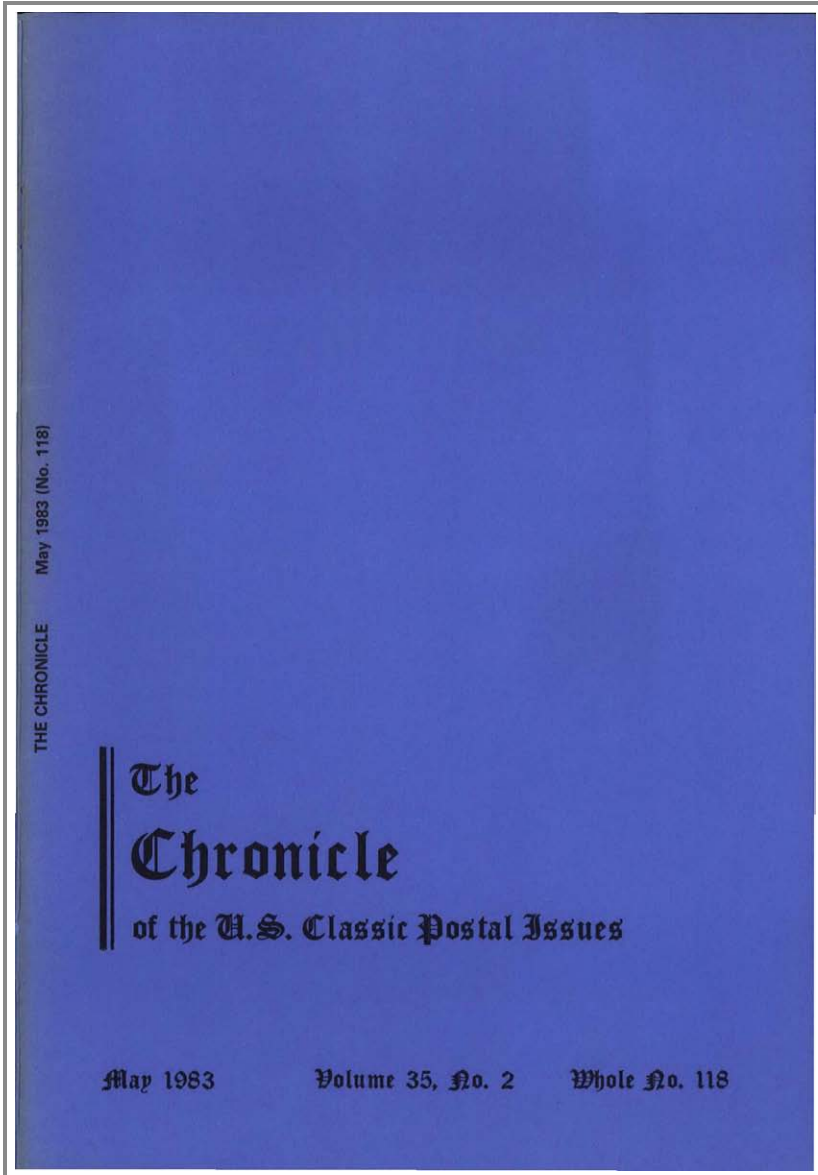

A true deluxe book must be printed on a fine paper different from the regular edition and have text changes within the signatures in addition to a fine binding. For both books we used Laid Curtis Rag paper and binding by Adolphus.
